So we went back down and lugged a concrete block up and secured it to the four wires. So we tossed it over and it whooosh! hit the ground hard in less than a second. Angels must have been working that day. We went to just about every Boris Karloff and Vincent Price movie and road our bikes all the way to the zoo. We found a passion for fishing and every trip was a catastrophe waiting to happen. One time our little kicker pooped out and we drifted

down the middle of the St. Johns we decided to check out what these crab traps looked like. As we started pulling one up...Pow!!.. the water started exploding around the boat. Turns out some crabber with a high powered rifle didn't care for us messing with his traps.

We were known music travelers. We did the Miami Pop Festival (before Woodstock), Cream also in Miami (traveled with Ronnie Van Zandt, Allen and Gary on a Greyhound. Went to all the Be-In's with the Second Coming (Allmans) and all the others. He followed my band up to Michigan and toured with us in the winter snow. Those were the days!
