“ Today my husband is getting cremated. We are not having a service due to the risks of large gatherings because of the pandemic. He died of complications triggered by COVID on September 6, 2021. He was vaccinated back in March and thank God that his suffering was not as bad as it would have been because of it. He spent 19 days in the hospital, and I was only allowed to see him on his last two days. I'm very broken-hearted by his death, and the pain is unbearable, but I have faith that because of our Savior Jesus Christ, the pain will not be as bad as time moves on. I'm so blessed to have the support of my children, family, brothers and sisters of the church, friends, neighbors, and my coworkers and his coworkers.

Don and I often talked about how when we went to funerals, people always talked about the person that died as though they were a saint, never having done anything wrong. We did not want that for us.

My husband was not a patient person; he did not like large gatherings, and he was not an easy person to get to know because he was not a social person, but most people that got to know him liked him.

He was a loving husband, loving father, and he adored his grandchildren. Politically he was a conservative person and was very worried about the political state of affairs. He prayed for a better world for his grandchildren. He was also brilliant, and he spent his spare time reading and learning about everything. He also put to practice some of the things that he knew. With the knowledge he learned from books, he built two houses. He did the plumbing, electrical work, and the building on his own. He enjoyed viewing the YouTube videos of how to fix things. He loved working with wood and working on his cars and tractor. He did his best to teach his children to be self-reliable. The three of them know how to take care of their cars and houses. He would like to be remembered for his love for his family and his faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

He has a strong testimony of the gospel of Jesus Christ. He was very active in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and he looked forward to the Saturdays that we worked in the Orlando Temple. He was so thrilled when he heard about the building of the Tallahassee Temple because that was often in his prayers. He did his best to be a worthy priesthood holder. In my opinion, he was an excellent priesthood holder. He was very kind to the people he liked and loved.

Every day I told him that I loved him and that he was the most wonderful husband in the world, and he would say "I try."

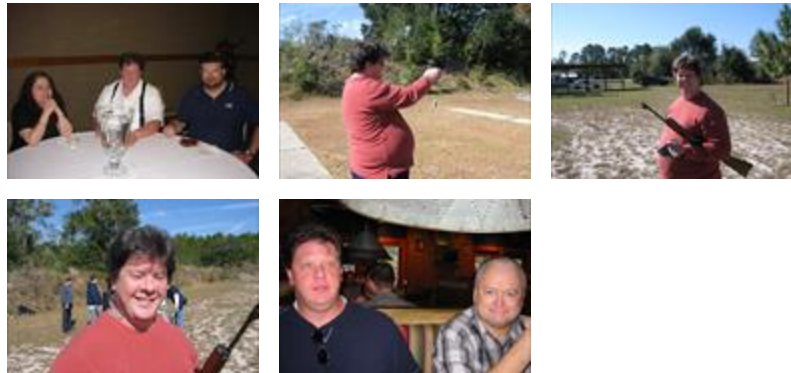

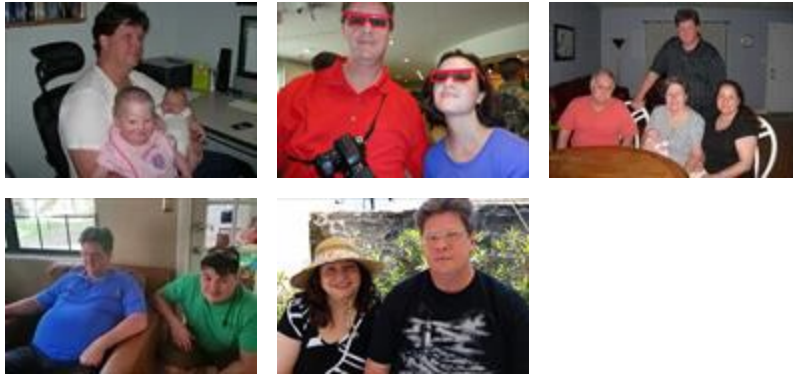

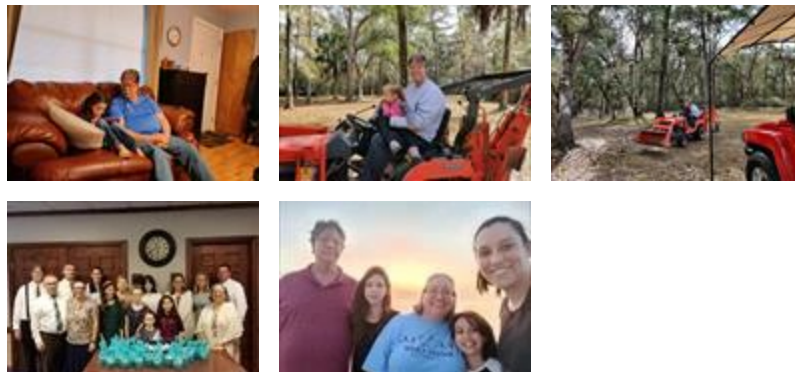
