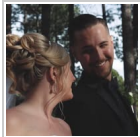

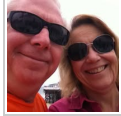
Thank you for sharing that, Robin. Stories of time spent with your family were always a part of time spent with Joey. He loved you all very much.
