July 24, 1935 - July 25, 2020

Philip Oliver Vause Sr., 85 of Crawfordville/Woodville died Saturday July 25th with his family by his side. Philip graduated from Leon High School in 1953. He was in the Army National Guard for two years before joining the United States Navy. He served four years of active duty aboard the USS Gregory DD 802 and was in the Navy Reserves for an additional four years. After discharge from the Navy he attended Florida State University while working at Woodville Lumber Company and then Booker and Company. He was employed by the Florida Highway Patrol in 1964 as a State Trooper. He was stationed in Ocala, Florida. While in Ocala he was an active member of Northside Missionary Baptist Church. Twenty years later he returned to Wakulla County. He became involved with the Dogs Hunters Association and the Recreation Department. He was even a great "Santa" for the festivals at the Rec Park, Shadeville and Medart Elementary schools. Philip was a member of the Masonic Lodge #294. He was also a member of First Baptist Church of Woodville. He was an outdoorsman who loved to hunt and fish. Philip was very much a people person who loved his time at the Flea Market, swapping, trading or just visiting with everyone.

Survivors include his wife of 61 years, Loyce Pennington Vause, his mother Pearl Oliver Vause, four children, Cynthia Ann Vause, Philip Oliver Vause Jr. and wife Robin; Shane Eric Vause and wife Kim. Michele Vause Lawhon and husband Chris. Six grandchildren, Philip Oliver Vause III, Mitchell Andrew Vause, Taylor Marie Lawhon, Cajah Alan Vause, Trenton Wayne Lawhon and Remie Shane Vause.

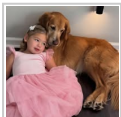

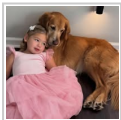

As a kid growing up in Cedar Hills Mr. and Mrs. Vause were almost second parents to me. I remember Mr. Vause in his State Trooper uniform before his retirement... he was always somewhat larger than life to me, a big man with a big heart. It's interesting how just one person can have an impact on your life. He was the type of man willing to help if he possibly could, which he did on more than one occasion for me. One time when I was around seventeen my mother and father were out of town. I got myself into big trouble around 2 AM with no one to call for help but him. He got out of bed, came down to get me and brought me home. No judgement. He asked if I'd learned my lesson, then never said another word about it. I will always remember and appreciate that.

I was always amazed at how he could catch fish, even when nobody else was catching them. The first REAL Bass Master I've ever known. I know he loved his sweet tea and Mrs. Vause's was and is still to this day the best I've ever had the pleasure of drinking. And I drank a LOT of it! Although he never said anything he had to have been peeved to find (again) that dang near empty jug!

A few more fond memories: his Chevy with RVT's, Grasshopper bass boat, Salt Springs hunt club, that CB base station that could broadcast to China- RedDog (!), the day he brought a mini-bike home for Cindy and Phil. Many, many more. Rest in Peace Mr. Vause. I know you are in a better place, smiling and awaiting your family's arrival.

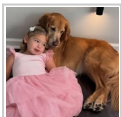
Thank you. I was young when he had to retire, due to his injury, so I don't have many memories of his trooper days.

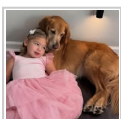

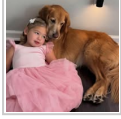
