Thomas J. Henning, known to many as Tom, 75, of Tallahassee, passed away on November 30, 2025.

Tom proudly served his country as a Vietnam War veteran in the United States Air Force. After his military service, he became a familiar face in the Tallahassee community as the owner of Tom's VW Works and Last Chance Recording Studio, where he shared his passion for craftsmanship, creativity, and connection.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Andrew and Cecile Henning, and his sister, Treva Castelberry.
