During this time, they brought in an elderly couple that they met to live with them to give them a better home and quality of life for their last years. They also owned and operated a farm, and then she also worked in a plumbing business. While during the summers she owned and operated firework stands with her daughter. Then she moved to Missouri.

In Missouri she managed a restaurant in a theme park in Branson Missouri for years until she retired.
